2024 EAA Chapter 105 Poker Run

Revised: Saturday, September 14, 2024

At each stop you will either draw or be dealt a card. The dealer will then put his/her initials on the card and YOU will put your initials on the card. Each stop uses a different color marker.

There are a total of 6 airports dealing cards. You will be playing a 5-card hand. If you can't make it to all 5 airports (weather, slow airplane, etc.) extra cards will be available at the last stop at Twin Oaks Airpark. Other than the first and last stops, go to these destinations in the order of your choosing.

Fly Friendly: Study Flight Guide for airport traffic pattern, noise abatement and unique hazards. Make standard radio calls on arrival and departure...airports will be busy. Keep in mind that some aircraft do not have radios.

Destinations

Lenhardt's Airpark- 7S9: Registration, entry fee (\$20 for chapter members/\$25 for non-members) and first card will be at the airport office from 8am-9am. The Whiskey Hill Store (one block South from the airport) has a fantastic store with homemade breakfast and coffee. Cards will be dealt from there after 9am if you're late.

Independence- 7S5: Starduster Café. Another great breakfast option along with another card.

Corvallis- KCVO: Pick up card at Corvallis Aero.

McMinnville -KMMV: Pick up card at Potcake Aviation.

Seaside- 56S: Randall Henderson will be dealing cards. He may have some drinks and snacks available.

Twin Oaks Airpark-7S3: Chapter Hangar. Be back at Twin Oaks by 4:00pm for dessert and prizes.

Please bring a wrapped "white-elephant-type" gift (this does not mean junk ©) and a dessert to share (if you can).

2024 EAA 105 POKER RUN YANKEE SWAP RULES

- Pilots and passengers can register and pay their entry fee and draw their first card at the FBO office at Lenhardt's Airpark (7S9) from 8:00 a.m. until 9:00 a.m. If they are late, they can draw a card at the Whiskey Hill Store a block to the south and pay their entry fees at the Yankee Swap prize award at the end of the run at Twin Oaks. Each player can pull another card from the dealer at each of the following locations in any order: Starduster Cafe at Independence State Airport (7S5), Corvallis Aero at Corvallis Airport (KCVO), Potcake Aviation at McMinnville Airport (KMMV), Randall Henderson's hangar at Seaside Municipal Airport (56S), and Hangar G1 at Twin Oaks Airpark (7S3). The player and dealer must initial each card when drawn. Extra cards can be pulled at Twin Oaks Airpark to make a five card hand if necessary to accommodate the weather and/or slow aircraft. If you flew to all six dealers and have six cards, you can only play five.
- You must be present to play. You can not play anybody else's poker hand for them; they must be present to win. You can not trade cards to build a better poker hand.
- Dessert will be served at 4:00 p.m. at Twin Oaks Airpark, and the prize selection and Yankee Swap follows dessert.
- Each player gets to pick a prize until all prizes are unwrapped.
- The order of picking shall be determined by the descending order of the players' Poker Hands in the following order:
 - a. Royal Straight Flush
 - Straight Flush
 - Four of a Kind
 - d. Full House
 - e. Flush
 - f. Straight
 - g. Three of a kind
 - h. Two Pair
 - i. One Pair

- High Card (aces high).
- Ties are broken by order of suit as follows: Spades; Hearts; Diamonds; Clubs
 The Best Hand picks a wrapped prize and unwraps it.
- The next best hand then picks a wrapped prize, or can "steal" an unwrapped prize.
- If an unwrapped prize is "stolen", the theft victim can then "steal" a different unwrapped prize, or pick a wrapped prize. A "stolen" prize can not be "stolen" back immediately by the victim of its theft.
- If a theft victim picks a wrapped prize, we proceed to the next best hand, until all prizes have been unwrapped.
- 10. A prize can only be "stolen" twice before the final prize is unwrapped, which means it can be picked three times, once while wrapped, and then "stolen" twice while unwrapped, except after all prizes have been unwrapped, the Best Hand can exchange their current prize with any other prize, regardless of the number of times it has been stolen. Thereafter, the players are free to voluntarily trade prizes.
- All prizes must be kept in plain sight at all times.
- All prizes must be removed from the premises by the person holding it at the end of the game.
- Any contestant can cry foul if they think a rule has been violated and obtain a ruling, and are encouraged to do so, as the moderator needs all the help he can get. However, no crying and no whining will be tolerated.
