EAA MOURNS LOSS OF YOUNKIN, FRANKLIN IN AIR SHOW ACCIDENT (via EAA Website)

July 11, 2005 - Aviation and the air show community suffered a tragic loss on Sunday, as Jim Franklin and Bobby Younkin died when their airplanes collided during an air show performance in Moose Jaw, Saskatchewan. "This is a tragic loss, as it is anytime this happens in the air show community, and our deepest condolences go out to each man's family," said EAA President Tom Poberezny, who as a member of the Red Devils and the Eagles Aerobatic Team until 1995, had flown in many air shows that also included Younkin and Franklin.

The Program:

The August program will be an 'open house' at Lenhart Airpark. The hangars house many craft of chapter 105 and 902 members, and many beautiful planes of the other residents. Count on a barbeque dinner and peeking into open hangars. Come on over and meet the folks that make Lenhardt's a friendly place to fly from. I'm hoping hangars will start to open at 6:30 or earlier, but count on dinner to come off the grill -- and our usual, short chapter business meeting to start -- at 7:00 PM.

Driving From Portland:

Take I-5 south to the Aurora exit. Continue past Aurora airport on the 'Wilsonville-Hubbard Hwy,' and hook up with Hwy 99-E, continuing south. Arriving in Hubbard, take a left at the Shell gas station, or if you miss that turn,

take a left at the next chance, marked "To Whiskey Hill Rd." on the left side of the street. Go three miles east; use caution at the three short bridges -- the middle one is very narrow and bends along its span. At the next intersection following the bridges (Meridian), turn left and prepare to park when the airstrip comes into view.

Flying In:

Lenhardt Airpark (7S9) is about 4 NM SSE of Aurora airport. Fly left-traffic (1000' TPA) for rwys 2 (calm wind) and 20. CTAF uses 122.9. Announce your intention for the paved (2950' x 45') or grass strips. Note that ultralight traffic flies at 700' TPA, and stays east of the

field, so be alert for right-traffic for rwy 2. Early arrivals can park near the fuel truck and office at the south end of the field, later arrivals will find space further north. Please help keep a lane open for the fuel truck.

Board Meeting Highlights

Your Chapter 105 Board

This evenings meeting was moved, at the eleventh hour, to Chili's in Beaverton, owing to the warm day and previous plan to meet at the chapter hangar. Attending this evening were John Halle, Rion Bourgeois, Randy Lervold, Mike McGee, Randall Henderson, Jim Pace, Joe Miller, Ralph Schildknecht, and Benton Holzwarth. (Anyone is welcome to attend, but it's best to check with a board member to be sure we haven't changed date or location following publication in the newsletter.)

• The previous meeting's minutes were circulated ahead of the meeting and were quickly adopted without corrections.

Scheduled/Old Business:

• Tables on Loan: Bob Martilla had earlier requested use of the chapter's tables to be used at the Camas Washougal Airport Association barbeque. Rion had circulated the request to the board by email, and received a few yeas and no nays so went ahead and OK'd their use. He raised the point for ratification at the evening's meeting.

• AirVenture Camp: Our candidates for sponsorship to AirVenture each, for one reason or another were unable

to attend. We were contacted by a young man from Springfield, OR, requesting assistance. We quickly agreed to sponsor his trip (airfare + tuition = \$1500). Discussion followed on whether and how we ought to advertise the opportunity to our own members in the future. JimP suggested including info with the YE certificates.

• Project Hangar (Rion for TomL): The plan for the mezzanine is out. There is no practical way to work around the roof support beam to make a large area and the halfsized areas we could make aren't worth the trouble. We're still investigating pushing out the west wall to a corner, to allow increased viewing up and down the runway. A contractor is now looking over the plans.

• Prop Balancer: Bob Stark has enquired as to whether he might be able to rent the chapter's prop balancer for use on his customer's planes. A rental figure of \$50 - \$75 per plane was floated. The original 'rule' when the prop balancer was purchased was that it was only for use on club member planes. We agonized over the position for some time, trying to see a clear way to make it work (both for the extra income to the chapter and to do Bob a good turn) vs. the fear of additional wear and tear on the unit.

In the end, the deciding factor seemed to be the logistics of making it available for Bob, since it usually stays with one or the other of the two 'teams' that have been trained to operate it. In the end, we felt we needed to stay with our initial rule and decline Bob's offer. On the other hand, Bob is welcome to make whatever arrangements he wants, to sign-off maintanence on club members props on certified planes. We've been doing a prop clinic following most First-Saturday Breakfasts, since buying it.

• Upcoming Meeting Locations (RandallH): August: Open House at Lenhardt's, BentonH hosting; Sept: Alan Jessmer / Precision Airmotive presentation on Fuel Injection and Carbs at the Chapter Project Hangar. Suggestions for future meetings: Leighton (?) is building another Lancair Legacy and would host a meeting. Len Kauffman offered a look at his RV-8 project at Aurora airport.

• Signs (JimP): The old signs are down. Tom Louris is working up the lettering and logos for new signs to be executed in vinyl lettering on a sealed wood backing board.

• Upcoming Board Meeting Locations: RandyL has reserved the meeting room at Baja Fresh (address noted at end of this report) for the next three months (Aug/Sept/ Oct).

• Oregon International Airshow (Rion): Show is planned for Sept 9-11 this year, with a Friday evening show, plus Saturday and Sunday day shows. As we've done in the past, we'll organize and host an experimental static display 'corral' adjacent to the Mushroom. We'll need to provide our own 'security', but the show-folks will have stanchions and yellow tape for us. With that, most lookers seem to take the hint and respect the planes.

John Halle is organizing an experimental fly-by for the airshow. Since formation flying isn't allowed w/o 'card's and lots of extra paperwork, John's working with the airshow and airport folks for a definition of formation vs. in-trail flight, to see what sort of presentation we can do. Ron Singh would like to participate with his RANS S-12XL, and John will be working to mix this with the RVs and his even faster Lancair Legacy. RandyL has been signed up to announce for the fly-by. Forms for the pilots participating in the fly-by need to be submitted soon.

• Poker Run: Jenny sent me (Benton) a blurb for the newsletter; I'll forward it to Randy for the webpage. She was rushing to get things taken care of before dashing off for Oshkosh, but was nice enough not to gloat.

New Business / Open Mike:

• Breakfast Volunteers: Len Kauffman joined us to share his info on folks opting out of working the First Saturday Breakfasts. He's about gone through the alphabet since taking over the volunteer organizing and notifications, and since we simplified the process for opting out. (The board had concluded there was no point in deluding ourselves and continuing to hound folks who just weren't going to show up no matter how much we hoped they would.)

Of the 190+ folks on the roster, about 145 remain active and available. Many are glad to help, appreciate the reminders and if can't work a particular session when their names come up ask to just be pushed back a month in the rotation rather than reach for the opt-out button. Everyone agrees that the turn-out has been much better since Len has been more actively reminding the help, allowing us to schedule fewer for each session to get the crew we need.

• RV Homewing Newsletter Archive (MikeM): Amit Dagan has organized an archive of the newsletters of the RV Homewing. The plan is to make it available on the chapter 105 website as well as selling CDs of the collection.

• RV Fly-In shirts (and chapter hats, etc): We have extra shirts from the last two years of the RV Fly-In. They (and the other chapter merchandise) need to be brought up to the breakfast hangar and made available for folks to buy if they'd like. They'll never sell if they're just put away out of sight.


