The RV-1

Until recently, the RV-1 was located in Utah. Its new owner is Jack Lenhardt and lives at 7S9 now, where I caught up with it for these pictures.

It began life as a Stits Playboy in 1968. It mounts an O-290D engine of 125 HP. Says Jack, "It's a lot slower than an RV-3, but flies almost the same."

He's planning to bring it to the Van's gathering later in the summer; watch for it!

For those that have not been involved so much in the Van's Aircraft RV series of kit built planes, this is the one where it all started.

Beginning life as a Stits Playboy the airplane had room for improvement. Originally it had an open cockpit and strut braced fabric covered wings. As with any good experimenter and engineer, Richard VanGrunsven embarked on some of those improvements. Van designed an all aluminum cantilever wing and covered the cockpit along with a host of aerodynamic cleanups.

When he started over with a clean sheet of paper the RV-3 was born.



One thing that sustained me during the long years in the garage building my airplane was the articles in the Home Wing newsletter and elsewhere by people with flying RVs, telling about all the fantastic adventures they were having. Sometimes it was hard to believe that so much fun could be had -- surely these people must be exaggerating! I've now been flying my plane for 7 years -- about the same length of time it took to build it. And I can tell you there is no need for embellishment about what great adventure-machines these are.

I know you builders are out there doing the same thing I was doing years ago, sweating in frustration and thinking that this damned thing will never be done. So I'll offer some motivation of the type that sustained me when I was building my plane.

Take last weekend for example. I was among a group of people from my company who were scheduled to go to Yakima to put on a big presentation for some customers. The first thing that came to my mind was of course to fly up there. I mean, who wants to drive 4 hours when you can fly in an RV and get there in under an hour?

Builder Motivation



Some of my co-workers who are into stargazing had a different idea -- to go up early with their telescopes, find a dark spot away from city lights, and have a star party.

It all came together when I suggested we make it happen at Tieton Airstrip, a grass strip on Rimrock Lake up in the mountains 30 NM west of Yakima. I'd been there once many years ago and remembered it as a lovely airplane camping spot.

So on Sunday afternoon I piled into the plane with one co-worker and a baggage compartment full of camping gear. Even with a minor diversion around the north side of Mt. St. Helens to view the progress of the new lava dome, we had no problem making it to Tieton Airstrip in less than an hour. We set up camp and headed down to the end of the strip for a swim in the lake. I was expecting a quick bracing dip, but the lake turned out to be the perfect temperature -- just cool enough to temper the hot weather, but warm enough that once we got used to it, we didn't want to get out.

Eventually the poor sods who were driving showed up, and as nightfall set in they got their gear set up and pulled out the telescopes. One guy has a nice 10-inch scope and once the sky got really black we were able to get fantastic views of a number of astronomical phenomena -- double stars, nebulae, Jupiter and her storms and moons, and even distant galaxies.

Early in the morning as the sun was just beginning to

mountain tops, we emerged from our tents, donned our slacks and dress shirts, smoothed out the wrinkles and headed down to Yakima for the dog-and-pony show, which we executed with stiff professionalism and no hint of the fact that we'd slept in

After the presentation we got a ride back up to the airstrip, then my co-pilot and I bid farewell to our co-workers and settled in for one more evening camping out. After all, why hurry? We were able to get up in the morning, take another leisurely swim, break camp and still make it back to Hillsboro and into work before the rest of the tired souls who'd had to make the long trip back by road the previous evening.



Flight of Discovery comes to Seaside

As most people who know me are aware, my wife and I have been spending more and more time down at the coast since building our second home near Seaside. We've also been getting more involved in the local community. I serve on the local airport advisory committee,



and Jeanne and I have both been spending a fair amount of time doing volunteer work for a local land trust and natural history center which is, coincidentally, the closest local "point of interest" to Seaside Airport (see www.nclctrust.org/gateway.html).


On the weekend of August 12-13, these two pursuits are coming together when the Flight of Discovery makes a stop at Seaside Airport. F.O.D. is a group of pilots who are historians, scientists, naturalists and environmentalists who, in 2004, retraced the route of the Lewis & Clark Trail by air. You may remember the article



"Incredible Journey", in the September 2004 AOPA Pilot magazine that described the expedition (see www.aopa.org/members/files/pilot/2004/journey0409.html.) The group flew a variety of airplanes

including a Cessna Caravan, a 182, several 172s, a Piper Twin Commanche, and a Waco YMF. The purpose, much like the original expedition's, was both educational and scientific, and along the way they collected data about the changes in the landscape since Lewis & Clark's time and connected with local pilots, naturalists, educators and students.

This year the group will be conducting a similar mission, this time to retrace Lewis & Clark's return route. The

Old Business:

• Minutes from the June board meeting were approved as published by Benton.

Hangar:

- Tenants: Rion reported we still do not have any tenants
- Sign: Randy reported that Randy DeBauw volunteered to paint the sign after which he will apply the graphics which are already done. Tom Louris will then hang it.
- Hangar warming meeting: Randall was not in attendance, but ...

Arlington recap:

• Randy reported that \$500 was advanced for meeting/party expenses, 53 people paid and \$280 was collected for a net cost of the event of \$220.

Golf Cart:

We are still looking for a volunteer to take on the refurbishment of the chapter's golf cart. Woody has a source where new batteries can be purchased for ~\$300. This is to be held until someone can verify that the rest of the car drive train functions correctly. A volunteer will again be sought at the August general meeting

Meeting schedule:

 The meeting schedule was not reviewed since the meeting coordinator, Randall Henderson, was not in attendance. Mid-year financial statement review:

- The chapter's financial statement y.t.d through 7/18
 was reviewed. All seems to be proceeding according to
 the annual plan put in place in February. Cash has
 recovered as expected and we appear to be in the
 black.
- Based on the advice of the chapter's accountant, and the fact that it no longer fits the strategic purpose for which it was purchased (long term saving for a chapter hangar), a motion was passed to liquidate the T. Rowe Price mutual fund account which has a present balance of approximately \$6000. The proceeds are to be merged with our general funds.
- It was suggested that the Treasurer find an interest bearing account to hold surplus cash if our present bank does not offer such a vehicle.

Open Floor:

- Mike McGee showed the board the excellent signs he has posted for the air compressor system for which the board expressed their appreciation.
- Len Kauffman has written a letter requesting that a Blackhawk helicopter from the Salem ANG attend one or more of our chapter breakfasts as an interesting display piece. It was noted that the crew will get free breakfast. It was further noted that they should arrive by 7:30 and depart after 10:30 so as to avoid having to park on the far side of the runway. Len will continue to manage the process.
- Ralph suggested that with parking now on the far side
 of the runway we should consider having a "crossing
 guard" to monitor and control pedestrian runway
 crossings. Such a position could also provide basic
 ground control for aircraft parking. It was pointed out
 that the chapter golf cart would make this job easier.
 Ralph has tentatively volunteered to do this duty.


