The September meeting will be at Ray Fogg's house on Sunset Airstrip. Ray is building an RV-8A (slo-build), and hopes to have the panel ready to light up by the time of the meeting. Ray's house is on the west taxiway at Sunset Airstrip, always a nice place for a September meeting -- we can go out and pretend it's a Van's Homecoming, pre-Aurora.

#### **Driving**

From all points east: Take Highway 26 west to the Glencoe Road/North Plains exit. Turn left at the top of the ramp (stoplight), and go over the overpass. Just across the overpass on the right is Beach Road; turn there and take it all the way west to the end where it Ts onto Gordon Road; turn right (north) on Gordon road, Ray's house is the 6th house down on your right.

From Hillsboro, take Glencoe road north, just before the ARCO station turn left on Beach road, follow the rest of the directions above.

Park in the driveway, on the side of the road, or across the road by the oak trees. **Use caution** — **people drive fast on Gordon road**.


#### **Flying**

Sunset airstrip is northwest of Hillsboro airport and is on the sectional chart (PVT). The main runway is 6 and 24 which is 3000 X 100 foot grass. Note that the airstrip is just inside the HIO class D airspace and under the ILS approach to HIO. Consequently, pattern altitude is a low (500 feet) and everyone should contact HIO tower (119.3) as you transition their airspace. Check the windsock and note that the traffic patterns are set up to avoid flying over the big town of North Plains (just north of Highway 26, that means right hand pattern when landing

on RWY 6 and left hand when landing RWY 24). The east end of the runway has some tall trees and Van's old prototype shop at the end so use caution when landing to the west. The west end has no obstructions, but there's a road just past the end so watch for cars and don't get too low on short final. After landing, taxi down to the west end, turn right on the north/south taxiway. Ray's is the 5th house on the left.

# A Chapter Hangar Grand Opening and First Look at the Restored Bogardus Little Gee Bee







Meetings at airparks allow members to fly in to the meeting. Joe Blank got the prime parking spot this time. Rion grills up the evening's eats while Roy Thoma observes.



The centerpiece of the evening's program was the Bogardus Little Gee Bee. Dick retold the story of George Bogardus and his efforts to persuade the CAA that home-built planes could be safely flown.



President Randy got the meeting rolling with the usual club business then framed the evening program.

Randy brought the chapter meeting to order shortly after 7:00 PM on August 10th. The meeting was held at the new chapter hangar on Twin Oaks Airpark.

A few guests were introduced, one with a Zodiac XL well along in its construction.

Ron Singh pointed out the new Young Eagle packets to be available in the chapter Library area of the hangar. The plan is to have envelopes ready to go with all the information a YE pilot needs — info on procedures, releases and the YE certificate.

Dick then too a few minutes to talk a little about George Bogardus' flights to Washington, DC, under a special arrangement with the CAA, since the plane could not otherwise be flown beyond the Oregon border. Built in 1939 as a redesign of a Les Long 'Longster', George made the coast-to-coast flight in three days in 1949, and

again in 1951.

Joe Brockway had become a close friend of George and at his passing secured the disassembled airplane components and George's other artifacts — a lifetime of collecting photographs, letters and documents. He has also been working on a set of drawings of the Little Gee Bee.

The plane last flew in 1951 and accumulated 500-700 hours in its 12 active years.





Joe Brockway was instrumental in preserving the Little Gee Bee components and George Bogardus' photographs and other artifacts. At the end of the evening, planes scattered back to their home bases trying to beat the sunset.





#### **2005 Aviation Nation**

The 2005 Aviation Nation event was held November 12-13 at the Nellis Air Force Base in Las Vegas, the home of the Thunderbirds. The weather was a perfect blue 75 with light winds. Estimated attendance was between

125,000 and 140,000.

This event was a tribute to our military service men and women. The theme was "Operation Welcome Home" with guest speakers, fly-by's and aerobatic air shows, simulated Reno air races, static displays, souvenir booths, food & drink, etc.















There were hundreds of aircraft on display from a WWI biplane through WWII era fighters and bombers to our Air Force's current inventory of front-line fighters, bombers and transports, the F-117A Nighthawk, MQ-1 Predator, and America's 21st century fighter the F/A-22.

Aerobatic shows were given by some of the top civilian performers, such as Sean Tucker in the Oracle Challenger, Bill Reeseman in the Red Bull MiG, and David Martin in the Breitling CAP 232.

EAA chapter 1300 had a few pristine examples of their member's craftsmanship.

Groups of up to 16 RV's put on an impressive series of formation flying that resembled the talents of Vans Air Force. It was a fabulous event that should be repeated yearly.


