Rich Aden's Team Rocket F1 EV0

The chapter meeting for September was held at Rich Aden's home-shop in Longview. Rich is building a Team Rocket F1 EVO.

This evening's turnout of 16 or 18 folks included two guests—Scott Price working on an RV-10 and Bobby Freeman, recently moved from Sante Fe, and working on an RV-9.

Rich has been building planes since 1980, working with his dad on the early several: three –3s, two –4s and a Rocket. He traded a rebuilt RV-6 for tonight's subject EVO kit.

Rich relates the EVO's main advantages over the previous model is its speed above 8,000 feet and that it's way slower in landing—about like a –4 versus 90-95 mph in a standard Rocket.


There's no plans available, but a builder's manual is provided with the QB kits, which airframe costs ~ \$50k. The Team Rocket folks are now considering a 4-cylinder powered ship to compete with the RV-8, after they take care of a couple other projects.

On the subject or insurance, Rich says most people will only be able to get coverage after they're in Phase-II, and they'll want dual and lots of experience—on the order of 500 hrs. Rich expects RV experience will be considered.

Rich took six years to build his RV-6, and started on this kit about a year ago. He's the second owner, but it was unstarted when he brought it to his shop. There are six EVOs flying now. The nearest kits Rich knows of are one in Seattle and one in Colorado. Rich doesn't plan to keep his, just fly it for a hundred hours and move on. On the symmetrical components, Rich was alternating the direction of the rivets to balance the drag aspects of the mfg'd and shop heads. Alternatively, where the strength is adequate, one can use a 'soft' rivet and a cup-set on both sides to give the shop head a shape similar to the mfg'd head.

The main spar is built up from straps of 1/8" stock.

The Builder's Manual comes loose-leaf and shows many photos of the work.

I was offered a backseat in Len's RV-8 for a flight up with the chapter formation crew and had a blast.



Board Meeting Highlights

Your Chapter 105 Board

The latest meeting of EAA Chapter 105's board was held on 20 Sept 2007.

Attending: Randy Lervold, Rion Bourgeois, Norm Durrell, Dunstan Fandel, Ralph Schildknecht, Joe Miller, Mike McGee, Jim Mitchell, Benton Holzwarth, Tom Louris, Len Kauffman, Jenny Hickman and Joe Blank. The meeting was brought to order at 7:10 PM.

First order of business, the previous meeting's minutes were approved.

New Business:

• Hangar Biz: (Rion) Bobby Freeman is now renting a quarter of G-3. Ron Poe has sold his Citab and will move the RV-4 project from G-3 to his hangar on Twi-nOaks. Jim Maddox will move his project from G-1 to G-3, freeing it up for short-term projects like Annuals, etc.

• Hangar policy review:

• Discussion: G-1 is for short term projects, < 3 mo.

• Motion, to adjust rent for either hangar to \$280, prorated for fractional use in G-3. Motion carried.

• Randy suggests organizing a work-party to clean up the hangars before new tenants move in.

• Regular hangar biz: Donated sheet metal still stored in G-3. Mike worried about hangar rash if something isn't done with it. Also, excess HW from Al Paulson's project, asst HW (nuts and bolts) will be made available to members at half Van's catalog price.

• B'fast (MikeM): Chairs: 67 stackable chairs for \$400 purchased at local furniture outlet. Additional tables not chased down yet. Mike has some concern that there won't be floor space for more. Will do additional head-scratching and floor-planning before shopping.

Cashier status: Randy will bring a smaller set of materials (shirts, etc) for sale every month and take the cash box with him to make the bank drop. Len, Benton and Randy will rotate the breakfast cashier duty. Len has the duty for the October breakfast.

• Treasurer's report (Jenny): \$10k positive cash flow for the year, and in the black YTD, vs. \$3k same time last year. \$24k in the bank. Took a loss on the T Rowe Price mutual fund. Holiday party will bring more expenses at the tail-end of this year. We expect money to come in from the annual November Pie Auction. The Poker Run took in proceeds of \$680 (vs. expenses of \$1074.) Advanced Flight Systems (Rob 'n Jenny Hickman) donated drinks.

• Prop balancer report (Randy): The prop balancing equipment was sent in the mfg'r for calibration. They replaced the accelerometer (the vibration sensor) for free under warranty (a \$400 component) and cal'd the equipment. They were able to look at the records of the balancing work done, as it's stored in the unit, and had favorable things to say about the work we're doing. They also point to the info we have on our chapter website as part of their own promotion.

• Poker Run Plus: We had about the usual turnout for the poker run itself -- a little over 30 players. The shirt order was better guessed, and only a few remain. The campfire was a hit, the movie was a bit cold. The fly-in portion of the program showed limited attendance, and seemed somewhat lost in the shuffle.

Rion suggested trying to do the whole thing down at the chapter project hangar and cook the BBQ ourselves. There was some push back; it's nice to have the tables and a few utensils (the things we have up in the breakfast hangar.) There was some follow-up discussion on the fly-in part of the event. No one was very surprised that it's starting small, but most thought best to keep it included, and let it grow for a few years before making any judgements.

• B-17: Rion will cover the paper work, applying for next year's EAA B-17 visit if Dunstan will do the PR again. Both are in attendance and OK the duty.

• Motion to go ahead with hosting the B-17 again, if HQ offers. Passed.

• Breakfast: Inspector was there at 7:30 while everyone was trying to get set up. We were gig'd on using cloth towels (bath towels) to dry utensils. Must use paper towels or drying racks? Or just use the utensils wet? Inspector was vague about what would be OK, only firm on

what was wrong. (Shesh!)

• Tool crib (MikeM): Tools all accounted for. Hartzel prop wrench purchase still on to-do list. Pete Forsyth had our airplane scales re-cal'd. Discussion: Avery's wrench is for O-360s only; Joe will take over the hunt for an O-320 prop wrench. There was a suggestion that we ask Randy Griffin to fabricate one.

Next discussion was Firesleeve banding tools. RandyL has one that he says was cheap. There are flaring tools available to borrow. Along this line it was pointed out that Harbor Freight is opening a new store near where Hwy 217 meets Hwy 26, at the Cedar Hills Shopping center.

• Changes in registrations/renewals: In the past, memberships and renewals go to Jenny, who deposits money, who then forwards the info to Randy for database update. Randy is offering to take in joins/renewals and make the deposit himself. Recommending we change banks for convenience -- to Bank of America.

• Moved and approved to change banks, to Bank of America.

• Name Tags: Randy proposes changes to the nametag program: Put the order blank on a separate form (from the renewal form) and send it straight to Dunstan and he'll mail out. Bump up price to \$7.50.

• Benton will send Randy my intro (bio request) letter. Randy will change his subtitle from DB Admin to Membership Coordinator.

• Randall shared ahead of the meeting that he'll retire as meeting Coordinator. He's found Walt Foster to take over the task.

• '08 elections: Chapter bylaws allow up to twelve officers and Directors. We're currently accepting nominations from the membership. The chapter board also offers a slate of potential officers, in case no nominations are forthcoming from the membership: Jenny is willing to do Treasurer again. Benton is OK for Sec'y. JoeB would like to drop back to being a Director only, giving up VP spot. Randy will go another year as Prez. The board is now looking for someone to strong- arm into filing the VP position, with Joe and Len being the top candidates. At the Oct board meeting we'll finalize our

slate and present to the members, along with their nominations for voting at the Nov chapter meeting.

• TomL will look for a restaurant along the Hwy 217 corridor for our upcoming board meetings; Twin Oaks is a little far out for the folks that come from cross town. If something is found, we'll fwd the change to the Board mailist.

Open Floor:

• Everyone immediately noticed the spiffy new window blinds that Dunstan had ordered up and installed. Good job Dunstan.

• NormD has been researching the chapter's early history. He talked recently with Don Methven who was our Charter Prez, and who now lives near the Seaside airport, near Randall H.

He collected the original charter and some memoribelia. He's been trying to learn who the charter members were and has talked to three of the original members, but so far has only found the charter officers.

He will do a 28"x35"-ish poster to hang over door to our G-1 hangar. Framing in progress. Norm has talked with three original members. There was some discussion of bringing them to a holiday meeting or making some other gift.

• JoeB mentioned the NWS river forcaster having open house at their office, on 122nd between Sandy and Marine Dr, on first sat of Oct.

• Nov meeting: Our annual Pie Auction and technical presentation or showcase of some sort. Nothing is set up for the presentation yet.

• Randy talked about using some meeting SW and confcall, that is, getting the board together for our meeting via our home computers. He specifically made allowance for this in the latest update to our chapter bylaws. This could be useful if Randy is out of town, or we have a critical issue but a light load otherwise. Everyone is game to try, but a couple folks are on dial-up internet connections. (The meeting SW always requires a higher bandwidth connection.)

The meeting adjourned at 8:45.
