



Board Meeting Highlights

Your Chapter 105 Board

The latest meeting of the EAA Chapter 105 board was brought to order at 7:05 PM, 21Aug08. Attending this evening were: Randy Lervold, Dunstan Fandel, Jim Mitchell, Joe Miller, Benton Holzwarth, Michelle Smith, Tom Louris and Rion Bourgeois.

Rion offered a correction to the previous meeting notes, that he attended that meeting and an addition, that since the meeting Michelle Smith had taken care of discouraging the starlings that were beginning to nest at our chapter hangar.

With those two changes, the previous meeting notes were approved and we continued with the planned agenda.

• Hangar Update (Rion): Neil Arney is now occupying hangar G-3. G-1 is available for short-term use (1-2 months), e.g. final assembly or annuals. G-1 rents for \$280/mo.

• A chapter project would be fun, but the perenial problem is finding someone to ram-rod the project.

• Wi-Fi Extension: Progress has stalled on getting wifi internet access to the chapter hangars. We have some alternate directions to persue and are working our options for making headway.

• Breakfast Ops: Len Kauffman was unable to attend the meeting but forwarded some comments to the board for cosideration:

• Len continues to refine the KP task lists.

• The 'sneeze guard' suffered an accident at the last breakfast and Len spent \$5.75 for repair materials, needs reimbursement.

• Char recalls a previous decision that board members would get Food Handler's cards. Member present don't recall this, but yield that it's not a bad idea and a couple of us committed to running that down.

• Several of the breakfast tables are coming apart. JimM repaired a couple a month or two back. If more are coming apart he'll take another swing at 'em. If that doesn't hold, we'll look for a better solution.

• One of the grits cook-pots is beginning to peel its teflon. Board approved purchase of another to replace the bad one.

• Len suggested creating a 'Help Wanted' sign to post when/if scheduled KP duty folks don't show, hoping we can draw someone from the crowd. This seems like a great idea, with some suggestions to clarify the urgency--"KP Help Needed TODAY!" [Since KP helpers receive their breakfast gratis, Benton asked for clarification that if someone that has already paid for their breakfast steps up to help they should receive a refund. That was quickly agreed by Randy and Len in post-meeting email.]

• Joe distributed several copies of the Food Handler's Test Prep book that he'd checked out from the library. Several board members (Rion, TomL, JimM and Benton plus JoeM to renew his) have agreed to take the test, since someone with a food handlers card is supposed to be 'on duty' at each of our breakfasts.

• Also, we'll be adding an extra volunteer to the 9:00 AM shift as of the September breakfast, to allow JoeM to stop after one shift rather than work the double.

• Young Eagles (Michelle): One organized event remains this year, 6 Sep at Twin Oaks from 9:00-2:00. Michelle says they've been advertising the ride opportunity on Craig's List as well as posting notes at Libraries, etc. The crowds have been managable.

• Carl Dugger (Chap 782) reported on a non-YE kid flying event held over in Vancouver that was well attended.

• Meeting Coord: Walt Foster has held the meeting coordinator post for the last year, but has signaled his need to give it up due to medical issues. We have one member considering taking the task on, but he hasn't committed yet.

• Chapter Website Forums (Randy): Randy installed forum SW on the chapter website. Membership and traffic has grown slowly, but needs a boost to gain and maintain critical mass. We're looking for ways to generate more traffic.

• It was also noted that the projects area of the chapter website is out of date. Randy will update entries for anyone that forwards changes to him. Likewise, the roster book information can also be updated at any time.

• Poker Run Plus: This year's Poker Run will be held on Sept 20-21.

- (Rion) The insurance certificate has been issued.
- Prizes have been received (less the \$100 bill for best

hand.) \$49 reimbursement is needed. (Expenditure was previously approved.)

• Neil Arney is working on the trophy for this year's top place.

• Tee-shirt front-side artwork is done.

• Back-side artwork needs the list of airports visited. TomL suggested adding Newport to the rotation. (Newport's FBO has agreed to help.) Board agrees the list for this year's circuit will be: Twin Oaks, McMinnville, Independence, Newport, Tillamook and back to Twin Oaks. (I.e. switch Newport for Scappoose.)

• Michelle suggests holding back the Twin Oaks card until it's time for the awards presentation, just to maintain some mystery about who has the best hand.

• Last year's event came out at just about break-even, so we'll keep the same price for this year--\$20 as we recall. (Double-check.) Passengers can also play.

• For the 'Plus' part of the event, Michelle is recommending a Taco Feed caterer she's familiar with. There was some push-back on the price of last year's BBQ, and this will be about half the price of that.

• The camp-fire was a high point of last year's event, and will be repeated. Ron and Michelle will chase down firewood.

• For advertising, Randy will send out bulk email to chapter members with the details, with a reminder note the week before the event. Benton will forward the details to the other area chapter NL editors.

• Sep 21 morning fly-out: Randy will plan some venue for a breakfast fly-out. A couple hangars will be available for on-airport camping as well as tent-camping.

• Rather than schedule a Port-Potty for the chapter hangar, we'll instead make the golf-cart available and point people to the Twin Oaks pilot lounge.

With that final business covered, the meeting was adjourned at 8:00 PM.
