
About the meetings...



Board Meeting Highlights

EAA Chapter 105 18 Nov 2010

Benton Holzwarth, Sec'y

The meeting was held at the chapter's hangar G-1 at Twin Oaks airpark and called to order at 7:05. Present were: Len Kauffman, Bruce Rose, Jerry VanGrunsven, Bob Duncan, Denny Fuhrman (guest), Joe Miller, Sandy Bes, Roy Thoma, Ron Poe, John Jessen, Rion Bourgeois, Benton Holzwarth and Michelle Smith.

The first business, approval of the previous meeting's minutes was accomplished with no further correction.

• Picnic Tables: Bob Duncan has picked up the picnic table construction project from Benton. He's taken up the conversation with Bob Stark, who had earlier proposed that he'd finance four tables if we'd provide the construction and we'd each take two.

BobS is offering to provide his truck to haul the lumber. BobD also talked over our plan to upgrade our tables to cedar or redwood with our picking up the cost difference. BobD will make arrangements with Bob for shopping, will chase down a plan if they don't already have one, generate the materials list and plan the work parties to get the work done.

• Pie Auction: Jenny reported 31 deserts changed hands; high bid was \$40 for the Bourbon/Chocolate/ Pecan pie. The proceeds from the auction totaled \$614 (including \$22 in extra donations) along with some clever comments about where the weight went.

Bruce suggested that we might encourage our bakers to provide some smaller offerings, to make it easier for bidders that don't want to take home a full huge pie or bid that top price.

Also, the potluck idea seemed to go over well, everyone enjoyed the meal and as always there was waaay too much food. It seemed like maybe more spouses attended this meeting than previous pie-auction Novembers and we're suspecting it might be the incorporation of the evening meal vs. just the elections and auction.

There was general appreciation and commendation for

Rion's performance as Auctioneer.

• Holiday Party: Bob Duncan is opening his house this year. He's got food completely covered, is asking guests to NOT bring more. He'll total up what a meal has cost and put out a hat with a 'suggested donation' value. He suggested we issue an email announcement a week or two before the party, in addition to the NL announcement.

• Annual Planning Retreat: Our annual planning session will be held on January 22, starting at 9:00 AM. Two options for location are the conference room at the Pearson Museum or Bruce Rose is offering his house, with most people preferring Bruce's place.

Suggestion is for everyone to be thinking about director duties and budgets. It would be helpful if Jenny can provide itemized spending from last year, covering the budget areas and the spending amounts vs. the preapproved amounts from last year's planning meeting.

• EAA's B-17 visit: There'd been some confusion as to whether we'd be invited to host again this year, since recollection was that they usually contacted us earlier. At this meeting Rion was able to confirm that we'd been contacted and were all signed up to participate again this spring. (The B-17 usually comes through the week before Memorial day, as they like to spend the Memorial day weekend in Seattle which makes a good next stop from Hillsboro.

• Newsletter: The handoff from Benton to Sandy Bes continues. The current plan is for me (Benton) to do the December issue, and help Sandy pick up with the January issue. Suggestion was made that Sandy should be thinking about a budget for NL publishing tools.

• Dec board meeting: The group decided to skip the December board meeting unless some pressing business should arise.

• Director Reports:

• Rion notes that the annual chapter paperwork will hit Ron's inbox next month. Also, we'd discussed changing our chapter liability insurance limits earlier in the year. If anyone wants to reopen that discussion now would be the time, as that will be up for renewal soon. Everyone present agreed (by quick vote taken) we were satisfied with where we'd left it previously, no changes needed.

• Ron Poe observed Bob Stark's offer to partner on a CubCrafters Carbon Cub kit saying this'd be a great way to get into a share of one of these airplanes. Bob's putting together a builder's center.

• Benton will forward the breakfast cashier schedule to Len and Joe. Joe is deciding he'll stay on at the pancake dishing station three of four months and rotate in for one cashier shift. [Done.]

• Bruce has done some tidying around G-1. He gave the deposit bottles and cans to one of Bob's helpers. He also noted that the chapter has a bending brake squirrelled away in another hangar that can be moved to the chapter's hangars.

• Roy is ready to pass on the broken prop trophy.

• Rion commented on the Stark's long-stored C-38 Airmaster. We'd marveled at the flare launchers, but Rion noted they even still have flares loaded. (Yikes!)




